<b>Abstract:</b>	This collection contains the live taping and edited versions of Meet The HistoryMakers: A Day of Education (Chicago 2002). This collection contains detailed records of the fundraising for the event, records of the production of the live event, the editing process of the video footage, research on the honorees and talent, press releases, graphics used during the shooting and photographs from the event. On October 17, 2002 at the Wyndham Hotel, in Chicago, Illinois The HistoryMakers hosted Meet The HistoryMakers: A Day of Education. The event focused on exposing Chicago Public School teachers, librarians, and students to the educational resources created by The HistoryMakers, using oral history as a tool for studying United States history. As part of a third annual event, HistoryMakers from around the country served as panelists and speakers in a series of seminars discussing their experiences in the fields of sports, medicine, law, politics, civics, media, religion, education, science, business, music, entertainment, style, art, and the military. The event featured 50 such HistoryMakers, such as Cordell Reed, Ella Jenkins, and Reverend Jeremiah Wright.

## Biographical Note by The HistoryMakers®

### The HistoryMakers

The HistoryMakers is a national 501(c)(3) non profit educational institution founded in 1999, committed to preserving, developing and providing easy access to an internationally recognized, archival collection of thousands of African American video oral histories. The HistoryMakers is the single largest archival collection of its kind in the world designed to promote and celebrate the successes and to document movements, events and organizations that are important to the African American community and to American society.

The HistoryMakers is the next methodic and wide-scale collection effort since the WPA Slave Narratives Project from 1936 to 1938. The HistoryMakers goal is to complete 5,000 interviews of both well-known and unsung African American HistoryMakers. In recording messages of leadership, achievement and perseverance embodied in these life stories, The HistoryMakers has disseminates its holdings through traditional and interactive media as well as public programs, special events, an interactive website and a unique digital archive.

The purpose of this archive is to educate the world on the accomplishments of African Americans, show the

breadth and depth of this important American history as told in the first person, highlight the accomplishments of individual African Americans, showcase those who have played a role in African American-led movements and/or organizations and preserve these video oral histories for years and generations to come.

## **Dr. Billie Wright Adams**

Medical professor and pediatrician Dr. Billie Wright Adams ( - ) was the program director in the Department of Pediatrics at Mercy Hospital. Adams also served as an associate clinical professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago College of Medicine while maintaining a private practice.

## **Hon. John Allen**

Superior court judge Hon. John Allen (1943 - ) was appointed Chattahoochee Judicial Circuit Superior Court judge in 1993 and has held appointments as a city attorney, a Recorder's Court judge and State Court judge.

## **Renee J. Amoore**

Healthcare chief executive, healthcare executive, and nurse Renee J. Amoore (1953 - ) is a home health care entrepreneur and has served as the vice chair of the Republican Party of Pennsylvania.

## **Dr. Gloria Jackson Bacon**

Medical director and physician Dr. Gloria Jackson Bacon (1937 - ) dedicated her life to providing health services to the underprivileged housing project Altgeld Gardens. Dr. Bacon founded the Clinic in Altgeld, which reduced the infant mortality rate in Altgeld Gardens from 50.2 per thousand to 9.2 per thousand.

## **Ruth Beckford**

Choreographer and dancer Ruth Beckford (1925 - ) toured with the legendary Katherine Dunham for fifteen years, founded the first recreational modern dance department in the United States, and also helped found the Oakland Dance Association and the Black Dance Association.

## **Leo Branton**

Entertainment lawyer Leo Branton (1922 - 2013 ) established a private legal practice when no integrated or African American law firms existed and represented prominent African Americans including Nat King Cole, Dorothy Dandridge and civil rights activist Angela Davis.

## **Alfred Brothers**

Engineer and airplane pilot Alfred Brothers (1942 - ) was an officer in the United States Air Force for twenty-two years, serving as a pilot and wing commander in the Air Force ROTC, before working as an engineer program manager for Magnavox.

## **Clark Burrus**

Bank executive and city comptroller Clark Burrus (1928 - ) is a financial expert and was the first African American comptroller for the City of Chicago.

## **Manford Byrd**

Elementary school principal, school superintendent, and high school principal Manford Byrd (1928 - ) has worked for the Chicago Public Schools as a teacher and administrator, and served in several deputy superintendent positions before he was appointed general superintendent of schools.

## **Earl Calloway**

Newspaper columnist and newspaper fine arts editor Earl Calloway (1926 - ) writes for the Chicago Defender.

## **Robert Church**

Agriculturalist Robert Church (1909 - 2008 ) became Peach County, Georgia's first black county agriculture agent. In this capacity, he taught African American farmers and their families the latest agricultural techniques in order to increase production, improving their living standards.

## **Dolores E. Cross**

College president and education professor Dolores E. Cross (1938 - ) has served as an associate professor of education at Claremont University in California, Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and Special Programs at City University of New York, president of the New York State Services Corporation, president of Morris Brown College and president Chicago State University. She has chronicled her life story in a memoir entitled, "Breaking Through the Wall: A Marathoner's Story," published by Third World Press.

## **Dr. Augustine Davis**

Pharmacist and soldier Dr. Augustine Davis (1917 - ) was a World War II Navy gunner and Pearl Harbor survivor. After the war, Davis attended Ohio State University and earned his B.S. degree in pre-medicine, then graduated from the Ohio State College of Pharmacy, one of the few blacks to have done so at the time.

## **Belva Davis**

Television anchor Belva Davis (1932 - ) was the first African American female newscaster in San Francisco. Davis worked as anchor and urban affairs specialist for KRON 4, where she worked full time until 1999, when she became a special projects reporter for the television station. Davis also hosted and helped to create All Together Now, one of the country's first prime-time public affairs programs to focus on ethnic communities.

## **Thomas W. Dortch**

Corporate chief executive, community leader, association chief executive, and transportation chief executive Thomas W. Dortch (1950 - ) leads the 100 Black Men of Atlanta, GA.

## **N. John Douglas**

Broadcast chief executive N. John Douglas (1938 - ) worked as a research scientist at Lockheed Research Laboratories in Palo Alto, California and is now the CEO of Personal Achievement Radio.

## **Ausbra Ford**

Sculptor and art professor Ausbra Ford (1935 - ) has taught at Chicago State University and lectured around the country. In support of his interest in the funeral art of Afro-Americans, Ford received a National Endowment for the Humanities Fellowship as well as a grant from Chicago State University to conduct research on the funerary art of West and Central Africa.

## **Jewelle Taylor Gibbs**

Social work professor Jewelle Taylor Gibbs (1933 - ) is a noted author, clinical psychologist, college professor and member of the Santa Clara County Democratic Central Committee in California. Gibbs was the first African American professor appointed to an endowed chair in the University of California system when she became the Zellerbach Family Fund Professor of Social Policy, Community Change and Practice at Berkeley.

## **Jonathan Green**

Painter and printmaker Jonathan Green (1955 - ) is a renowned painter of black Southern life. The artwork of Green is heavily influenced by his Gullah heritage with vividly colored paintings and prints documenting everyday chores, in addition to celebrating Gullah life's rites of passage. His work is in the permanent collections of numerous museums, including The Morris Museum, The Afro-American Museum of Philadelphia, and The Naples Museum of Art.

## **Frank Greene**

Entrepreneur and investment chief executive Frank Greene (1938 - 2009 ) is a Silicon Valley venture capitalist who founded Technology Development Corporation.

## **Hon. Floyd Griffin**

Colonel, mayor, and state senator Hon. Floyd Griffin (1944 - ) is the first African American Mayor of Milledgeville, Georgia as well as a former Georgia State Senator. Griffin's twenty-three-year career in the military began in 1967 when Griffin served as a helicopter pilot and flight instructor in Vietnam. Griffin commanded an engineering battalion at Fort Stewart, Georgia, and he was later assigned to the Pentagon. Retiring from the military as a colonel in 1990, Griffin taught military science at Wake Forest University.

## **William Hudgins**

Bank chief executive and banker William Hudgins (1907 - 2007 ) is the founder of both Carver Bank and Freedom National Bank. After six years under Hudgin's presidency, Freedom National Bank grew to be the largest bank in the United States owned and operated by African Americans. Hudgin also formed another side-venture, Best Yet Hair Products mail order company for black women, in 1943.

## **Julie Hunter**

Real estate entrepreneur and retail entrepreneur Julie Hunter (1912 - 2009 ) is a former representative at the U.S. Social Security Administration, and is the owner and manager of her own real estate company.

## **Dorothy Jackson**

Civic activist and city government official Dorothy Jackson (1933 - ) was the Deputy Mayor of Akron, Ohio. After twelve years with Goodwill Industries, Jackson left to begin her sixteen-year career with the Akron Metropolitan Housing Authority, as the social and tenant services administrator. In her role as deputy mayor, Jackson was a tireless social activist.

## **Ella Jenkins**

Folk singer Ella Jenkins (1924 - ) is a popular children's folk musician. Smithsonian Folkways Records has

produced over 30 Ella Jenkins albums since 1956. Generations of children have a deeper understanding of the world through her participatory music. Jenkins has served as a U.S. delegate to Hong Kong, China and the former Soviet Union with the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.

## **Josie Johnson**

Civil rights activist, academic administrator, and education consultant Josie Johnson (1930 - ) is the founder of the Black Studies department at University of Minnesota and is a member of the Minnesota Board of Regents.

## **Carlotta Walls LaNier**

Civil rights leader Carlotta Walls LaNier (1942 - ) was part of the historic Little Rock Nine.

## **Matthew Little**

Association branch chief executive and civil rights activist Matthew Little (1921 - ) is head of the Minnesota NAACP.

## **Richard Long**

Author Richard Long (1927 - 2013 ) is a renowned scholar of language and the arts who has taught at several universities. Long is the author of *Black Americana*, and his work has been included in more than twenty anthologies and encyclopedias of African American culture.

## **Charles McAfee**

Architect Charles McAfee (1932 - ) is internationally recognized for his architectural work. McAfee is known for his work wide ranging work including; the renovation of Oklahoma City School District 89, Atlanta's North Line Midtown Station, Wichita's Calvary Baptist Church, and McAdams Park.

## **Hon. Curtis McClinton**

State senator Hon. Curtis McClinton (1913 - 2012 ) is a former Kansas state legislator who passed the first civil rights act in twentieth-century Kansas. McClinton also holds the honor of being Kansas' first African American state senator.

## **James D. Montgomery**

Civil rights lawyer James D. Montgomery (1932 - ) founded James D. Montgomery and Associates and was appointed corporation counsel for the City of Chicago under Mayor Harold Washington. In 2000, Montgomery became a managing partner in the law firm of Cochran, Cherry, Givens, Smith and Montgomery.

## **Geraldine Moore**

Drummer Geraldine Moore (1929 - ) was the leader of all female band that backed comedian Jackie "Moms" Mabley.

## **Rose Morgan**

Personal care entrepreneur and beautician Rose Morgan ( - 2008 ) owned and operated the largest African American beauty salon in the world beginning in 1942. In 1955, Rose Morgan's House of Beauty opened, and

included a dressmaking department and charm school.

## **Waverly Person**

Geophysicist Waverly Person (1926 - ) was the first African American to be the chief scientist at the National Earthquake Information Center for the United States Geological Survey in Golden, Colorado. Person is renowned as an earthquake spokesperson for national and international media.

## **Robert Pickens**

Football player and wrestler Robert Pickens (1943 - ) was an olympic athlete who went on to become Cook County, Illinois Commissioner.

## **Hon. R. Eugene Pincham**

Civil rights activist, county circuit court judge, state appellate court judge, and trial lawyer Hon. R. Eugene Pincham (1925 - 2008 ) grew up poor in Alabama before becoming a fixture in the Illinois legal system. As a judge Pincham, had a reputation of seeking justice for the poor as well as the rich.

## **john powell**

Academic administrator, nonprofit legal director, and law professor john powell (1947 - ) is a specialist on poverty and race, and was the National Legal Director for the ACLU. He holds the Gregory H. Williams Chair in Civil Rights & Civil Liberties at the Moritz College of Law.

## **Cleo Parker Robinson**

Artistic director, choreographer, and dancer Cleo Parker Robinson (1948 - ) founded the Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble. Robinson attempts to educate audiences about the rich heritage and ancestral gifts on which this predominately African American ensemble draws through its many programs. She serves as first vice president of the International Association of Blacks in Dance.

## **Renault Robinson**

Community activist and police officer Renault Robinson (1942 - ) is the founder of the African American Patrolman's League and former head of the Chicago Housing Authority. Robinson is known for successfully bringing a civil rights lawsuit against the Chicago Police Department for discrimination against African Americans and Latinos. His work was instrumental in increasing the numbers of minority Chicago police officers.

## **Rev. Albert Richard Sampson**

Civil rights activist and pastor Rev. Albert Richard Sampson (1938 - ) was ordained by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and then worked with Rev. James Bevel to help organize Resurrection City for Dr. King's Poor People's Campaign. Rev. Sampson became pastor of Fernwood United Methodist Church in Chicago in 1975. An activist minister, Sampson is a consultant on the Black Heritage Bible.

## **Albert Stiles**

Entertainer Albert Stiles (1922 - ) started a program called the Talent Factory, teaching inner city youth the theater arts. In 2002 he released the compact disc, "We Can Fly," which he produced with his son, jazz drummer Ronald Stiles. He has also performed with such stars as Josephine Baker, Duke Ellington and Charlie Parker.

## **Dr. Louis Sullivan**

Medical administrator Dr. Louis Sullivan (1933 - ) served as the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, in addition to founding the prestigious Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia. Sullivan hosted the public television show, "Frontiers of Medicine," and is the founding president of the Association of Minority Health Professions Schools.

## **Johnny Washington**

Baseball player Johnny Washington (1930 - ) was a versatile player in the Negro and Minor Leagues, and a veteran of the Korean War.

## **Willye B. White**

Long jumper Willye B. White (1939 - 2007 ) has competed in five Olympic games and is the founder of the Willye White Foundation, helping children to develop self-esteem and become productive citizens. At sixteen, she earned a silver medal in the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games, becoming the first American woman to ever medal in the long jump.

## **Doris Zollar**

Community leader and entrepreneur Doris Zollar (1930 - ) is on the Women's Board of Operation PUSH and the Women's Board of the United Negro College Fund. She is the first black president of the United Nations Children's Fund Chicago, and works with the Chicago Heart Association, the World Service Council of the YWCA, Deborah's Place home for battered women, Chicago Academy of Performing Arts, and was appointed to the board of the Chicago Port Authority.

## Detailed Description of the Collection

### Series I: Program Footage, October 17, 2002

#### Raw Footage (51 Betacam SP Videocassettes)

Raw Footage: Opening Session: Line Cut, TRT: 0:30:03

This tape contains the line cut of the opening session of the 2002 Meet The HistoryMakers: A Day of Education program recorded at the Lakeshore Rooms of the Wyndham Hotel in Chicago, Illinois on October 17, 2002. Since 2002, The HistoryMakers has hosted Meet the HistoryMakers: A Day of Education as part of its year-long educational initiative in Chicago Public Schools. The event attracts an audience of more than 300 public school students, teachers and librarians who participate in a wide range of interactive sessions. The speakers for the opening session were Julieanna Richardson, Executive Director of The HistoryMakers; Michael Scott, Vice President of AT&T Broadband and Chairman of the Board of the Chicago Public Schools; Linda Vaughn, Illinois State Board of Education; Albert Bertani, Chief Officer of Professional Development for Chicago Public Schools; and Risa Davis, Citigroup Chicago Area Manager. The speakers introduced the day and spoke of the various sessions that would later take place. Richardson spoke of the origins of the HistoryMakers and the Day of Education. She introduced each of the speakers. Scott spoke about the importance of the HistoryMakers and of African American history in the future of public education in Chicago, Illinois. He related the HistoryMakers mission to his family history and experience on the Board of the Bobby E. Wright Comprehensive Behavioral Health Center in Chicago, Illinois where he got to know Roy Chappell, a HistoryMaker. Vaughn spoke about the importance of the partnership between the Illinois State Board of Education and the HistoryMakers in relation to education. Bertani spoke about the importance of the HistoryMakers in public education. He emphasized the potential for the use of technology in the classroom. Richardson recognized the HistoryMakers present during the session. She acknowledged the sponsors and contributors to the HistoryMakers and the program. The program sponsors included the Wyndham Hotels, Hertz Rental Car, Chrysler (lead sponsor), AT&T Broadband (lead sponsor, Walgreens (lead sponsor), Chicago Tribune (lead sponsor), ComEd (lead sponsor), Veranda Dickens (lead sponsor, WVON, The acknowledged HistoryMakers sponsors and contributors including the City of Chicago Office of Communications, Hilton Hotels, Holiday Inn Hotels, Chicago Metro History Fair, and CitiGroup. Richardson thanked Sandra Guthman, from the Hope Foundation, for her part in creating the "Becoming a HistoryMaker" curriculum guide, and Risa Davis, Citigroup Chicago Area Manager, for her support for "Pioneers in the Struggle" and the HistoryMakers public school teacher training. Davis spoke about importance of HistoryMakers and "Pioneers in the Struggle." She announced a grant from Citigroup of 75,000 dollars to

the HistoryMakers. Richardson concluded by speaking about importance of developing a digital archive for accessibility. She thanked Rose Morgan, for encouraging interview referrals. She acknowledges the support of the HistoryMakers by the Illinois Humanities Council, Kraft Foods, and McDonald's.

Raw Footage: MediaMakers: Camera 1 Tape 1, TRT: 0:30:00

This tape contains the raw footage from camera one, tape one from the MediaMakers session of the 2002 Meet The HistoryMakers: A Day of Education program recorded at the Lakeshore Rooms of the Wyndham Hotel in Chicago, Illinois on October 17, 2002. Since 2002, The HistoryMakers has hosted Meet the HistoryMakers: A Day of Education as part of its year-long educational initiative in Chicago Public Schools. The event attracts an audience of more than 300 public school students, teachers and librarians who participate in a wide range of interactive sessions. Hermene Hartman, Editor of N'Digo in Chicago, Illinois, moderated the session with Belva Davis, journalist and television newscaster and activist in San Francisco, California, and Earl Calloway, journalist with the Chicago Defender in Chicago, Illinois. Session began with a showing of clippings interview footage from various MediaMakers. Hartman spoke about program, acknowledged HistoryMakers present and introduced speakers.
